Project and Rearing Fund Raffle Update

With only a few weeks to go, we need EVERYONE to give one last push to SELL, SELL, SELL tickets for our chapter's Project and Rearing Fund raffle. As of June 16, we have only about \$1500 to invest in stocking muskies. Proceeds from every ticket sold before the July 10 drawing will go directly for the muskie resource.

We have a great muskie fishery in the Twin Cities metro area, thanks in part, to the efforts of our chapter and past raffles. Help stock more muskies. EVERY \$20 BOOK OF TICKETS YOU SELL WILL PURCHASE ONE MUSKIE FOR STOCKING. Its up to each of you. How many fish do you want to stock? Lat's all try to sell one more book of tickets.

We may have several opportunities to stock new lakes this year, but without our dollars, the MN DNR may have to wait to get started.

The raffle drawing will be held at our July meeting. Top prize is a Triton 176 Liberty with a 90hp Mercury and Triton Trailer. Second place prize is a \$300 shopping spree at Thorne Bros. Custom Rod & Tackle, third prize is a \$150 shopping spree at Joe's Sporting Goods, and fourth prize is a signed, numbered "Live Log" print by Les Kouba (valued at \$1000).

We had a number of people from the Capable Partners organization who had a variety of physical handicaps. These guys, like all true fishermen, didn't let anything get in their way! I've been fishing with Stan for 3 years now and let me tell you, he's not afraid to cast anything. Unfortunately the fish didn't want to cooperate. The group got one 42-incher and saw a couple more. Good thing we had a good cook! If you haven't participated in this event, put it on your calendar for next year. We can always use a few more guides no matter what your skill level.

We're in the final stretch for this year's Project and Rearing Fund raffle. We'll be drawing the winner of the brand new Triton boat at the July meeting. I would like to say that we're ahead of last year, but we're not. Everyone in the chapter has to get it in gear if we want to stock some fish! If you have tickets, please do what you can to either sell them or buy them. If this fundraiser isn't successful, we won't be stocking any fish this year. We need every dollar we can raise because there's a very good chance that the DNR is going to need our help for the first year's stocking of a new lake this fall. If we can't come up with the money, then we may have to wait a year.

Staying on that topic of new muskie lakes, George Selcke and I are going to be in a DNR meeting June 25th to talk about getting Pokegama Lake in Grand Rapids stocked with muskies this year. A big thank you to all of you who sent an email or voicemail to Ron or Mark at the DNR. It's through those efforts that we were able to get them moving again. I'll keep you posted on the progress.

I just want to remind everyone that this will be the 40th year of our chapter's muskie tournament. The event will be held September 7-9 on waters in the Longville, Walker, Cass, and Bemidji area. This year with the help of Frankies Marine and Triton Boats, we've been able to get the best boat we've ever had - a Triton 202 tiller powered by a Mercury 115 4 stroke. This rig retails for around \$35,000! Any angler entering a legal fish gets their name in the drawing for the Grand Prize boat package. That's not to mention the \$20,000-\$30,000 in additional prizes that will be awarded. Not only is this a great event, it's also this club's biggest fundraiser. If you haven't been to it before give it a try. It's cheap, you can fish any number of great muskie lakes and most of all - it's fun. Lure and Tackle Sale at Meetings to Benefit Youth Events

At every monthly meeting, I will be bringing a variety of items that were donated for the Youth Events from the Hugh Becker estate. All money raised by this sale will go to buying new lures and other items to be used as prizes and such, for youth related things.

My suggestion for items purchased is to give them to your kids for their own "starter tackle". Other ideas would be to give stuff to a kid (neighbor or relative) who doesn't have anyone else to take them fishing. Maybe you can be the one to help get them started? If you're really hard up, then get something for yourself too.

As for giving kids their own "starter tackle" – I know from personal experience, that things received for free are not always going to be taken care of (ex: rods/reels & lures) so it makes more sense (sometimes) to get a kid started with less expensive stuff. If they really get hooked on fishing, they will work up to it, otherwise, if not, you won't have wasted too much money! Of course, give them stuff that works and isn't trash. A bad experience fishing can be more detrimental than not fishing at all.

Same goes for spouses. Wouldn't it be great if our spouse actually WANTED to spend the day in a boat with us? Make it comfortable & enjoyable. Cater it for them. Maybe they catch

panfish (=have fun) while you cast all day for a muskie that may not show?

I took my wife fishing for panfish the first time we went. Beth loved it and since then has been learning more and enjoys going fishing. Now we're both members of MI and I hope she catches her first muskie this year. She's learned to handle and release small Northerns to the point that she WILLINGLY unhooked, and posed with a 10# Northern and her first Walleye (5# 10oz).

Lessons learned: I had to be patient with her from the start. Now I've got a fishing partner who can trailer the boat and is now ready to handle a large muskie by herself! She isn't ready, and may never be, hardcore enough for serious tournament fishing, but we have spent many hours in the boat! Everyone (kids, spouses and other adults) needs a good start. Perhaps the gear you buy at the meetings will be beneficial in that goal of teaching someone to fish.

Most of the gear is used, some are new or like new. I cannot bring everything, so contact me with any requests and I will bring it to the meeting. Items include: Musky/Pike size bucktails and spinnerbaits, Bass size baits, Walleye stuff (jigs, floats, hooks), Hair jigs, Treble hooks, Bobbers, Rods/Reels and other miscellaneous items.

A Muskie Tale

We were having a great trip with many fish in the boat for several days then came the storms followed by severe heat and scorching sun. In spite of having three guys in the boat, we were struggling to put together a pattern that would produce even a follow. I borrowed a very odd colored

bucktail from my friend's arsenal to try to mix it up a little. After a few casts a very large fish came out from under the boat headed away from me toward my incoming bucktail. The fish creamed the bait and immediately jumped all the way out of the water, tail and all. As it came out of the water I thought, that's not good, watching its violent head shakes attempting to throw the bucktail. Sure enough before the fish hit the water the bucktail came flying back at me, without the fish attached. As my friend at the front of the boat and I watched the fish fall almost in slow motion back toward the surface, we caught a glimpse of our other friend in the back of the boat completing a cast and about to go into a figure eight. Just as he started his figure eight, the fish landed right on top of his bucktail and became hooked upon impact. The fight was on, another rod. As he is fighting

the fish I'm in awe at what I just saw. Meanwhile he's yelling at me to get the net! I finally come to my senses, not nearly fast enough according to friend's accounts, and I proceed to the back of the boat and net the fish. Of course all three of us are rejoicing at this crazy moment we have just experienced and I in one of my dazed and confused moments induced by fishing too many extended days, forgot to make sure my friend had the net. As I look back, the hoop of the net is slowly drooping toward the surface and before I could get there, our acrobatic visitor seized the opportunity and escaped leaving the bucktail in the net. The Houdini fish as we like to call her still stirs up many different recounts of this crazy moment in time that usually result in a debate about who's fish was it if it had stayed in the net?

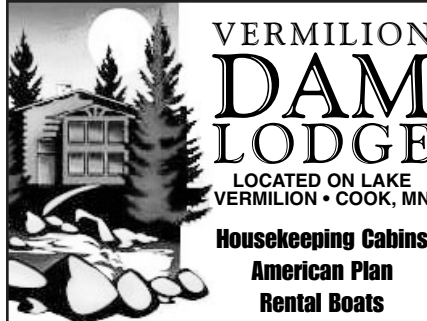

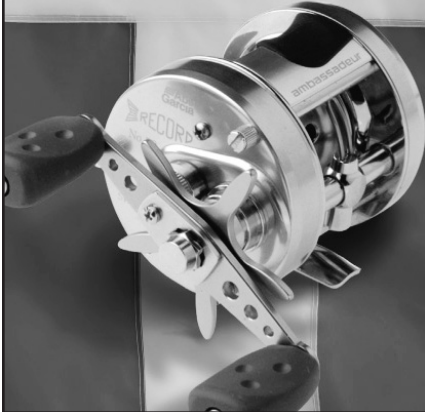

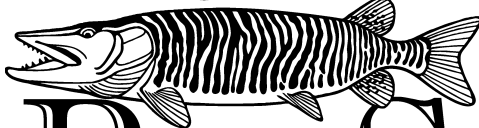
