he Twin City regional qualifying high school muskie tournament leading to the state final event was scheduled for June 19. However, an early morning line of severe thunderstorms forced a two-day postponement. Teams from Shakopee, Wayzata, Minnetonka, and Buffalo High Schools showed up early on tournament day, ready to compete. Each team was given a prize bag of Ron Schara books, new lures, used lures, hooks, and other fishing supplies. Before fishing started, there was also a drawing for a new Fenwick rod, a used Lowrance sonar/GPS, and a case filled with lures. After a brief talk about safety and invasives, the four teams set out on Minnetonka for their adventure.

The positive attitudes continued as teams started catching multiple species right away. Fish were active and teams were calling in fish. The team from Shakopee, Robbie and Michael Chance, landed a 44.5 inch muskie that ultimately won the event.

Everyone was seeing fish and several teams had fish on, but only one was landed. Most teams continued to see fish until the event ended at 1:00 p.m. when everyone went back to Gray's Bay for pictures and prizes. Members of the winning team each received a rod from Muskie Innovations. They will go on to represent this region in the state event July 2 on Lake Bemidji. The second place team from Wayzata HS each got a rod and reel donated from a chapter member. Each member of the remaining two teams was awarded a new bass rod from a member of our chapter. We had a great day and the teams look forward to participating next year.

Stocking and Rearing Report

he Twin Cities Chapter recently purchased 1073 year-old muskies from Oswald Fish Farm for \$14,000. The majority of these fish were placed in two western Hennepin county rearing ponds. The 15-acre Dubay pond (27-0129) was stocked with 450 fish and the 12-acre Pasenow pond (27-0195) received 360 fish.

Since this is the last year of the Lake Minnetonka, White Bear Lake and Eagle Lake DNR stocking study and considering the difficulty we have had in obtaining yearlings the past several years, it was decided that we would attempt to over-summer fish for our own use. The two ponds the West Metro DNR came up with are of sufficient size and depth that should be suitable for these fish to survive the summer, and yet be harvestable in the fall.

The DNR felt that a 50% minimum return would be very realistic for this project and didn't have any concerns with their ability to harvest the ponds in the fall. So, even at the worst projections, the chapter would have a value of around \$28 per fish which would equate to a savings of \$7 per fish based on last year's quotes.

The remaining 263 fish went into Lake Independence in order to free up some of the DNR's fall fingerlings. With our help, the DNR will now use their fingerlings for that portion of the study this fall. It is possible that the DNR may ask for more assistance with fingerlings, but has held off requesting anything until their harvest has been complete.

Trom Our President

The Armed Forces Family Fishing Celebration was Friday, June 22nd on Lake Minnetonka. Our chapter did a great job of getting members to guide military kids and families for a morning of fishing. After fishing, Maynards had a terrific lunch for all military kids, military families, and guides. All kids were given a complimentary gift bag of lures and fishing supplies. One of our members told me he remembered how important it was to his son, when he won a rod and reel. He wanted to make sure those types of memories are available to kids. So, for the second year in a row, he purchased a rod and a reel for the kid, who won the Muskie/Northern Pike Division. We will have more information in the article.

Instead of the July 10 General meeting, we are planning to launch at Hidden Falls below the Ford Dam and fish to Downtown Saint Paul. Afterwards, we can eat at Tiffany's (2051 Ford Parkway) and watch Baseball's All Star Game. Greg Ide is working on getting a church parking lot, as it would be tough to park with a boat trailer at Tiffany's. He has launched at Hidden Falls many times and said there is plenty of parking and the launch is good. We thought of it as an "assessment" of the area. Greg knows of two 48" fish caught there. Only 16 people fished last years Minnetonka outing and 12 came to the Tonka Grille, so we thought we would try something different. He will assess Hidden Falls before that time to be sure there are no safety issues. Fishing will be from 5 to 9 that night for League, if agreed to, and I think fish or even showing up should get double points. The event will be cancelled if there is lightning.

The High School Muskie Tournament is scheduled for July 2nd on Lake Bemidji. We will have an article on it in the August newsletter. The TC Regional was won by Shakopee High School. MI members Robbie and Michael Chance won the event and are advancing to the state tournament.







