

Cash prizes are paid to fifth place. All



Milting Muskies: A High School Student's Experience

In 2006, at the age of 11, I entered a fishing contest on Lake Miltona near Alexandria, Minnesota. The 21-inch walleye I netted that year literally hooked me on fishing. Today, I spend as much time as I can on Minnesota lakes, angling for bass and trolling for monster muskies. I am also taking a class on the environment at my high school, and recently had a wonderful opportunity to make "give back" to the fishing community.

I would like to thank the folks at the west metro fisheries office for allowing me to come along with them to Lake Rebecca in Delano to help collect Leech Lake strain muskie eggs for future stocking efforts. While there, I was able to participate in the fertilization process as well.

We began the morning by checking the trap nets they set out the previous day. After checking all of our nets, we managed to collect 11 males and 4 females, the smallest being 32 inches, and the largest 43 inches.

The muskies were brought back to our "base camp" on the beach and placed into holding pens based on gender. Immediately after sorting through our fish we set up the equipment for the fertilization. We began our attempt to net one of the females we placed into the female pen. Each of the muskies stocked had either its left

(LP) or right (RP) pectoral fin clipped or no clip, all based on year class.

Once we had our female (RP) we tried to find a two suitable mates from a different year class (LP). We then placed the muskies into separate holding tanks on the boat and used sedatives in order to calm the fish down to prevent any harm during the fertilization. Once the males were sedated, we used an aspirator to collect the milt and placed the milt into test tubes.

The process for the female required us to "massage" the abdomen towards the vent, releasing her eggs. We placed half of the eggs into a sterilized bowl along with the milt with one of the males. To fertilize the eggs we used a feather to stir the eggs and milt together, keeping the process as natural as possible. We repeated the process with the rest of the eggs and the remaining milt, and waited one full hour for the fertilization process to finish. After all this, we drove the fertilized eggs to the St. Paul fish hatchery.

When all was finished, we managed to fertilize 30,000 eggs, of which, only about 300 will survive to adulthood, all the more stressing the importance of Catch and Release fishing methods.

He said, "Sorry man, but I'm in a tournament and need another fish." He caught his fish and roared off, leaving us in no position to fish that dock. Just because you are in a tournament, you have no right to be rude to other anglers.

Did we think it would ever arrive? After a long 6 months of waiting the season is finally here! I am excited for the competition of another Members Only Contest. For those of you who haven't been a part of this before, it can be a great way to keep you involved and thinking about what is working and what isn't for more than just your boat.

Rules and Regulations to the Chapter Members Only Contest:

- 1 A muskie must be caught on legal sport fishing tackle (hook & line) in the United States or Canada in strict compliance with all local, state, or provincial laws and seasons. A muskie must be caught in season to count.
- 2 A muskie must be hooked and played by only one person, and only that person may enter the muskie in the contest. Assistance in landing is permitted.
- 3 Entrant must be a member in good standing of Muskies Inc. prior to catching the muskie.
- 4 All fish over 30" must be registered within 30 days of the catch. Only those fish over 30" will count toward your total points for the yearly contest. Fish that are not registered (or postmarked) before the 30 day limit will not count towards a members total points.

There are three ways to register your fish and they are as follow:

- a Register your fish on-line at the national website: www.muskiesinc.org. You must sign in to the site to register your fish.
- b Print out a registration form and mail it to: Eric Bakke, 290H BFAB, 516 15th Ave SE, Mpls, MN 55455
- c Fill out the registration form and email it to Eric Bakke at bakke193@umn.edu .
- 5 Release points are based on 4 points for each release over 30" and 1 point for each inch over 30". Any measurement of ½" or longer will be rounded up. Any fraction of less than ½" will be dropped.
- 6 The longest muskie released by a member of the Twin Cities Chapter Muskies Inc. (all divisions) will receive a free replica of their muskie courtesy of the Twin Cities Chapter Muskies Inc. and Lax Reproductions, 5455 Hwy 45, Conover, WI. (Total of 1 per year) This is the longest by total inches including fraction of inches. Here are the stipulations to win the replica:
 - a At least one verifiable witness and at least one verifiable side view horizontal photograph of the muskie is required.
 - b In the case of a tie, the fish that was caught and registered first (by catch date) is the winner and will receive the replica.
 - c Members may only win a free replica once every 10 years.
 - d Any and all discrepancies will be brought to the Chapter Contest Committee for review. Their decision will be final.

Now get out there and put some fish in the boat! Good luck to all and we will see you "On The Water"!
